### **NEW** Monthly Giving Program


During our 10 years of service, FieldHaven has successfully rescued and placed over 2,500 cats in new forever homes.

## From Garbage Can to Safety - The story of Kealani and Leikela

It was a wild ride for kittens Kealani and Leikela! A good Samaritan found them in a garbage can in Loomis, obviously in distress. She took them to a local veterinary hospital who called FieldHaven late in the afternoon to see if they could help. The kittens had very severe cases of ringworm, and most shelters are not able or willing to work thru the contagious, yet highly-treatable condition. The FieldHaven staff met the next day and decided that yes, those kittens would be saved. Staff and volunteers rushed into action when they found Animal Control had picked the kittens up from the Veterinarian's. If they arrived at the animal shelter, the next step facing them

would almost certainly be euthanasia. With assists from Placer County Animal Services, Benay, and volunteer Brenda, the kittens were intercepted en route and brought safely to FieldHaven where they began the regimen of bathing and treating the fungal infection that had put their little lives at risk.

In the weeks they have been at FieldHaven, they have been safely sequestered first in FieldHaven's Isolation room and then in Joy's beautiful Tack Room to give them more room. Restricted access and carefully followed protocol kept the kittens from passing the ringworm to other cats at the shelter while they improved. A special place in the sunshine is one of their favorite spots outside for them to recover and be the kittens they were born to be.

FieldHaven gave kittens Kealani and Leikela the gift of life.

Once the final clearance is given by the FieldHaven Veterinarian, these little girls will be spayed and ready for their forever homes. One of them

has already had an adoption application submitted (and we're hoping they might be able to stay together!) Wherever their next stop takes them, they are proof of what can happen when people care enough to get involved and get the right resources engaged. If you're wondering about the names, there was a contest where people bid on the naming rights. FieldHaven Board Member Diane won the contest and came up with the names. Kealani means clear sky or heaven and Leikela is Hawaiian for Rachel (Diane's daughter's name).

#### Coffee & Cats ?!


It doesn't seem like there's much in common between the two, but read on!

## Vet Corner: Ringworm

FieldHaven works hard to educate all adopters, volunteers, and the public about possible health concerns for themselves as well as the kitties. Here are excerpts from an article that accompanies our adoption paperwork regarding Ringworm.

#### What Is Ringworm?

Worms don't cause ringworm. Rather, this superficial skin infection is caused by a fungus that grows on the skin

#### What Are the Symptoms?

- Dry, brittle hair or hair loss in patches.
- · Severe itching.
- Red-ringed patch of small blisters or scaly skin. Call your doctor if you have a red-ringed skin infection, severe itching, a scaly rash or hair loss.

#### What Are the Treatments?

Your doctor may prescribe an antifungal medication. These drugs work to kill fungus and prevent it from coming back. You may spread the antifungal on your skin as a medicated shampoo, powder, cream or lotion; or you may take a pill so the medicine can spread throughout your body. Your doctor may prescribe a combination of these treatments.

Many antifungal medications, such as miconazole, are available over the counter at a lower dose and a less expensive price. Ask your doctor whether you can use one of these or whether prescription-strength medicine is necessary.

#### **How Can I Prevent Ringworm?**

Good personal hygiene helps prevent the spread of ringworm. Teach your child to practice good hygiene and generally not to share combs, brushes, or hats. Children also shouldn't share towels, clothes or sports equipment that haven't been properly cleaned.

Ringworm also can be transmitted from an infected dog or cat, so avoid animals who look mangy or have bald spots in their coats. If you have an animal that you think may have ringworm, see your veterinarian for treatment.

One of the things most appreciated by at least one staff member was the spirit of collaboration as the various rescue groups, shelters, trainers, etc. openly shared business plans, manuals, and many other ideas that might be helpful to someone else in moving toward the goal of no more homeless pets!

## Here are just a few of the themes the team came away with:

Television personality and Cat Expert, Jackson Galaxy says the way for us to adopt out more cats is to Play Play Play with them. Then when an adopter comes we say, "Look how fun and playful and cute kitty is!"



When night falls in Vegas the FieldHaven Ferals let their hair down, unsheath their claws and have a rockin' good time.

- The most important thing to a cat is "ownership of territory". Cats do not "pee" inappropriately to spite us, or because they are scared, anxious or unhappy. The most common place that they pee is on your bed or dirty clothing or the couch. Where your scent is most prevalent, they are saying "I love you".
- ♦ We all work hard. Discipline yourself and stay within your limits. Practice self care.
- ♦ 40-60% of animals in shelters are lost pets. Think "lost" not "stray"; a paradigm shift in thinking.
- Constant Promotion (regarding adoptions) is very important. Having a variety of Constant Promotions will let people know when they are ready for a new pet in their life that they can turn to us.
- ♦ There were many marketing ideas for spay and neuter, adoptions, and fundraising. Expect to see some exciting programs and promotions as FieldHaven puts some of these ideas into actions.
- Setting bold goals and protecting the FieldHaven brand were also new ways to think about how to make even more progress in saving more feline lives.
