Marysville Animal Care Services Community Partnership Programs Update: Year End Summary for 2019

Background

In mid 2018 FieldHaven and Marysville Animal Care Services partnered to address a long-standing overpopulation of unaltered cats and kittens within the city limits.

The partnership includes FieldHaven providing the following services:

- Vaccine and Microchip clinics for dogs and cats
- TNR services for all feral and community cats
- Community education for TNR and community cat programs, assistance and resistance mitigation

This document will provide a summary of activities and achievements during CY2019 as well as program-to-date statistics.

Activities in 2019

Vaccine and Microchip Clinics

We hosted three vaccine and microchip clinics serving 140 dogs and 75 cats for a total of 215 animals. In 2018 218 animals were served for a program total to date of 433.

TNR


In 2019 609 cats were TNR'd for a total 740 cats since June 2018.

All cats receive the following as part of the TNR "package":

- o Spay/neuter
- FVRCP and Rabies vaccines
- Revolution
- o Ear tip
- Microchip (for tracking purposes)
- Other minor medical care as needed





Funding

There are multiple funding sources for TNR, including Marysville Animal Care Services and several foundation grants.

From June 2018 – December 2019 51% of the 740 cats TNR'd were covered by Marysville Animal Care Services. The remainder were funded by grants from the Thelma Doelger Trust for Animals and TS & KD Glide Foundation.

Funding for the cats and kittens that are intaked into FieldHaven's adoption program is through FieldHaven's general fund. 446 kittens and cats have been intaked to FieldHaven since the program's inception. At an average cost of \$250 cat/kitten our cost is \$111,500 to care for them and prepare them for adoption.

Plans for 2020

We will continue our current services but will be adding some additional community support.

Vaccine and Microchip Clinics – We will offer them monthly or semimonthly depending on the need and community response.

TNR will continue at the rate of 15 – 25 cats per week while funds are available.

Kittens will be put into our foster program then will move into FieldHaven's adoption program or transferred to partner programs.

FieldHaven's Hathaway Cat Resource Center – with the success and community response to TNR the Town we have been receiving requests for assistance in areas outside of Marysville. In late 2019 we received tentative funding to open an office in Marysville that would serve as a center of operations for Marysville. In addition, it would position us to begin providing similar services to other communities in the area. We anticipate the Center opening in late first quarter 2020.

Colony Management – as we continue to collect data and identify colonies we'll begin aggressive colony management protocols to ensure the feeders are complying with feeding practices set forth in the guidelines of the feeding ordinance. Additionally, we will train all colony caregivers on accepted management and monitoring guidelines.
